

Eleventh call for the SNSF Professorship programme: 44 awards for 2010

The eleventh call for the SNSF Professorship programme attracted 201 applications from scientists in spring 2009.

August 2009 saw the completion of the first part of the procedure, when 62 candidates were invited to submit a detailed application. 59 persons presented their project in January 2010 to an evaluation committee of the National Research Council. In addition, the Council called upon the assistance of external experts during the second part of the evaluation.

The Swiss National Science Foundation has now awarded 44 SNSF Professorships to promising young researchers who have proved to be of exceptional scientific ability. The final selection placed particular emphasis upon the candidates' suitability and commitment to teaching.

The demands of the competition are at a very high level. In respect of the limited number of awards, which are at SNSF's disposal, very highly qualified candidates could not unfortunately always be taken into consideration.

For the first time, the Research Council has evaluated proposals in clinically oriented areas according to the new regulation introduced in 2009. In 2010, seven of the 16 subsidies in biology and medicine have been awarded to clinical researchers.

The proportion of researchers abroad who will return with an SNSF professorship to Switzerland in 2010 is 32%. The brain gain will continue to be an important aim of the programme.

The proportion of female scientists, who received 2010 an SNSF professorship, is 30%. The proportion after eleven calls for proposals is 29%. The SNSF will continue its efforts to increase the proportion of female scientists in the next years at least towards the targeted 30% .

The new SNSF professors are now working in nine Swiss Universities and both Federal Institutes of Technology where they will be active in research, teaching and clinical work and will enjoy the status of an assistant professor or the equivalent. The SNSF is confident that these professorships will prove to be a good start to their careers.
